

In pursuance of Headquarters' letter no. F-19/Director (P) Sectt./2025 dated 27-08-2025, it is hereby circulated for information to all Outsourced Staff of this office regarding the various Welfare schemes of the Government of India aimed at extending basic financial security, insurance coverage, pension support etc. to those engaged in outsourced employment.

A few of such Central Government schemes are enumerated below.

1. Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY): [https://www.pmjdy.gov.in/]

A National Mission for financial inclusion, this scheme facilitates access to basic banking services such as savings bank accounts, direct benefit transfers, overdraft facilities and accidental insurance cover. Jan Dhan accounts can be opened with zero balance in most banks.

2. Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY):

An accidental death and disability insurance scheme providing coverage of ₹2 Lakh at a nominal annual premium of ₹ 20, auto-debited from the beneficiary's bank account. It is available to individuals aged 18 to 70 years.

3. Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY):

A life insurance scheme providing coverage of $\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{?}{\sim}}$ 2 lakh at a premium of $\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{?}{\sim}}$ 436 per annum for individuals aged 18 to 50 years. It offers coverage for death due to any cause and is renewable annually.

4. Atal Pension Yojana (APY):

Aimed at providing pension security to workers in the unorganized sector, this scheme allows individuals between 18 and 40 years of age to contribute monthly towards a guaranteed monthly pension (ranging from ₹ 1000 to ₹ 5000) after the age of 60. Contributions are linked to the age of entry and selected pension amount.

In addition to above, State Government of Assam has some beneficiary schemes which are extended to outsourced staff. Here are some relevant schemes-

- 1. Apun Ghar- This is a housing loan scheme. More details can be accessed by visiting the website. Link- https://finance.assam.gov.in/schemes/detail/apun-ghar
- 2. Apun Bahan- A vehicle loan/interest subsidy scheme.
- 3. Un-organized Worker's Social Security- For those workers who are not regular

government staff, Assam has provisions under its Labour & Employment Department; registration, identity/smart cards, workers' facilitation centres, employment injury benefit, housing, educational support for children, skill upgradation etc. More details can be accessed by visiting site- https://labour.assam.gov.in/departmenthighlights/unorganised-workers
