#### (D) Knowledge Centre Activities

#### (i) All India Training Programmes

#### (a) All India Training Programme on Railway Audit (Civil and Mechanical)

The smooth working of Indian Railways is ensured by the various Technical departments as well as Non-Technical departments. In order to give the employees of the Railway Audit offices a better understanding of the functioning of the Mechanical and Electrical Departments of the Indian Railways, an All India Training conducted Programme was from 01February 2023 to 03 February 2023.

The Electrical General Services is responsible for the distribution of power supply to all Railway Services (except Traction purpose) and for the maintenance of passenger coaches (AC and non-AC coaches). The Power side of Electrical General Services is responsible for the installation, operation and maintenance of equipments' involved in the distribution of electricity to all Railway services (except Traction) and extension of power supply to

outsiders on Railway premises. HT 11kV supply is purchased from the State Electricity Boards and it is stepped down and distributed to various loads.

Mechanical Department, also known as Rolling Stock Department is responsible for maintenance of rolling stock including passenger coaches, freight wagons, Electrical Multiple Units/Mainline Electric Multiple Units, Diesel-Electric Multiple Units and Cranes.

Besides, it maintains large number of machinery & plant in workshops, EMU Car sheds, Coaching Depots, Freight Depots and other work centres. This department also formulates plans for procurement of rolling stocks, plant & machineries and ensures safety and reliability of stocks in train operations.

Officers from the Electrical as well as

Mechanical Departments of Indian

Railways were invited to deliver lectures

for the training sessions on topics such as

"Role of Civil Engineering Department in Open Line Works and Construction Projects", "Important points for preparation and checking of estimates of Construction Projects and Open Line Works", "Role and function of Mechanical Department in planning and maintenance of mechanical assets", "Internal Audit of Civil Engineering and Mechanical Engineering by Railway Accounts Department" etc.

#### (b) All India Training Programme on Compliance Audit

Compliance audit is an assessment as to whether the provisions of the applicable laws, rules and regulations made there under and various orders and instructions issued by the competent authority are being complied with. This audit by its very nature promotes accountability, good governance and transparency as it is concerned with reporting deviations, identifying weaknesses and assessing propriety.

The advent of Information Technology has changed the way we work in many ways, and audit is no exception. The ubiquitous Computer System is undoubtedly one of the most effective business tools. The Information Technology has revolutionized the existing procedure of conducting the Compliance Audit and provided an aided tool in the hands of Auditors.

An All India Training Programme on Compliance Audit (01 March 2023 to 03 March 2023) was conducted with the vision to disseminate the best practices being followed by the Audit Offices. The Audit Paras/Reports printed in the Catalyst 2021 as well as awarded during the Audit Diwas

2022 were selected for discussion as Case Studies during the training programme along with the approved case studies developed by this Institute.

The inauguration of the training programme was done by Shri Anadi Misra, Accountant General (Audit-II), West Bengal, Kolkata. In the first two sessions of the training programme, Shri Uttam Das, Core Faculty, RTI, Kolkata and Shri Rahul Barua, Senior Audit Officer, Office of the Accountant General (Audit-II), West Bengal discussed about the Compliance Audit Risk Profiling and Preparation of Audit Plan, Execution & Reporting of Compliance Audit. Mohammad Suhail Fazal, Deputy Accountant General discussed about the Activity based planning for Compliance Audit being practiced by the Office of the Principal Accountant General (Audit-I), Madhya Pradesh.

Other significant topics discussed during the sessions of the training programme included Use of Data Analysis Model in Accounts and Audit offices in analysis of voucher data obtained through VLC, Use of Remote Sensing and GIS in detecting encroachments and land use land cover changes in National Parks and Wildlife Sanctuaries with case studies, Use of Google Maps/ Google Earth in Public

Works with case studies, Receipts Audit with Case Studies, Audit Issues of Land Acquisitions and Allotment of Properties of Noida with case studies, Presentation on Audit on Flaws in system adopted for preparation of Schedule of Rates with case studies.

Principal Director, RTI, Kolkata discussed Case Studies on Fraud and Risks. He also discussed the Audit of implementations of Sustainable Development Goals as well as the Case Studies prepared by RTI, Kolkata. The sessions were one of the most appreciated sessions.

#### (c) All India Training Programme on Certification Audit of Railway Accounts

The Government owned railways in India are a departmental Commercial Enterprise. Railway accounts should, therefore, not only secure the essential requirements of commercial accounting but also conform to the practices of government accounting.

This objective is achieved by keeping the accounts of the railways on a commercial basis outside the regular government account and by maintaining a link between the two to show the revenue earned and expenditure incurred in carrying out the activities of the railways.

An All India Training Programme on Certification Audit of Railway Accounts was arranged from 13 March 2023 to 17 March 2023 with the vision to disseminate these intricacies. The training commenced with the sessions elaborating the Structure of the Railway Accounts and the Role and responsibility of Railway Accounts Department. The session was conducted by Shri Krishna Kant Goyal, FA&CAO (B&B). The training sessions also covered topics on Indian Railway Accounting Rules, Preparation of Railway Budget, various certificates issued by Audit, Computerised application software in the Accounts Department, various features of IPAS etc.

Regional Training Institute, Kolkata prepared a Case Study on "Approval of Building Plan by PRIs" during the period and the Case Study has been approved and disseminated by Headquarters. It is available in SAI Training Portal. The Case Studies on "Fraudulent Payment of Legal Fees" and "Punctuality & Travel Time in

Indian Railways" have also been prepared and sent to Headquarters for approval.

The STM on "Legislative Framework and Accounting Framework of Panchayat Raj Institutions has been updated and approved by the Headquarters and has been uploaded to the SAI Portal. The STM on "Audit of Railway Traffic Earning" has been peer

reviewed and the compliance of the Peer Review has been forwarded in the month of December 2022.

#### (E) Regional Advisory Committee Meeting

The Annual Meeting of the Regional Advisory

Committee was held on 22February 2023. The

meeting was chaired by Ms. Suparna Deb,

Director General, Office of the Director

General of Audit (Mines).

The Committee assessed the training programmes conducted by Regional Training Institute, Kolkata till the month of February, 2023 and also discussed the impact assessment of trainings, sharing of domain experts as faculties etc. The Committee appreciated the

efforts of Regional Training Institute, Kolkata in hiring domain experts from IITs, ICAI, ICMAI, ISI, ISRO-NRSC etc.

The discussion on finalization of the COTP for 2023-24 was also undertaken during the meeting and suggestions were received from the representatives of user offices. The COTP for the 2023-24 was finalized after incorporating the suggestions made by the RAC Members.

#### (F) General Training

#### (i) Commercial Auditing including Companies Act 2013

Companies Act 2013 deals with the formation, regulation, responsibilities, and dissolution of companies. It was introduced to replace its predecessor so that the act is more in accordance with the current corporate scenario. Additionally, this act also aims to encourage growth and of development the economy simplifying the process of setting up and maintaining an organisation. To this end, many of the rules and regulations mentioned in Companies Act 1956 has been revamped and modernised. The entities established under the Companies Act, 1956 or Companies Act 2013are audited by the Commercial Audit offices of Department as per the Section 19 of CAG's (DPC) Act, 1971.

The Institute conducted a training programme on Commercial Auditing including Companies Act 2013 from 31October 2022 to 04November 2022.

The faculties for the training comprised Shri Arijit Chakraborty, Chartered Accountant, Shri Prosenjit Sen, Senior Audit Officer, Office of the Director General Of Audit (Coal), Kolkata, Shri Falguni Bandyopadhyay, Senior Audit Officer and Shri Vivek Kumar Sharma, Senior Audit Officer from the Office of the Director General Of Audit (Mines), Kolkata.

Topics covered in the training were Overview of Annual Financial Statements and General Provisions for preparation of Balance Sheet and Profit & Loss Account according to Companies Act 2013. Government Companies and Audit mandate of Govt. Companies for CAG's Audit. Procedure relating to Certification Audit (Supplementary Audit) of Annual Accounts of Government Companies, Audit of items of Financial Statements (Balance Sheet, Profit & Loss Account and Cash Flow), Opinion on the Financial Statements Consolidation Process and Points of concern during Audit of CFS. The satisfaction level of the course was 4.87.

#### (ii) Contract Management

Contract management is the process of managing agreements, from their creation through to their execution by the chosen party, and to the eventual termination of the contract. Key activities involve performance analysis against the contract terms to maximize operational and financial performance and to identify and mitigate financial and reputational risk through noncompliance with contract terms. The topic is important for the officials posted at

Headquarters in offices as well as those posted in the Field Audit Party.

The training programme was inaugurated on 28 December 2022 by the Principal Director wherein he had highlighted the importance of Contract Management. Ms. Narayana S. L. Monica, Deputy Manager (Civil), Coal India Limited discussed about the Terms and Conditions of Contract, Significant clauses in contract and New Procurement Processes in the first two sessions of the training programme. Shri

Anup Kumar Dutta, Assistant General Manager, Hindustan Copper Limited discussed about the types the Procurement and Evaluation of Tenders in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> sessions of the training programme. Shri Sandesh Kumar Nagotia, Senior Audit Officer, and Shri Santanu Mukherjee, Senior Audit Officer discussed the Performance Audit of Contract Management of Public Works Department and Railways in the training sessions on 29.12.2022. Shri Shyamal Sarma, Senior Audit Officer discussed audit issues along with case studies on Contract Management in the Public Sector Undertaking (PSUs).

The participants appreciated the discussion of the case studies as well as the practical examples shared by the faculties and acknowledged that the discussion would help them in future performance audits.

#### (iii) Audit of Contracts and Tenders including Public Works

A proper tendering process is one of the building blocks of a sound governance system. Procedure for the acceptance of tenders and awarding of contracts, in government or private organizations, must be transparent, fair and open. Objectives of tender and contract audit are inter alia as follows:

- (i) Assessing the present controls of the organization over the tendering process.
- (ii) Identifying cost saving measures and effective utilization of resources.
- (iii) Prevention and detention of frauds and errors.

A five-day training programme was arranged on Audit of Tenders and Contracts commencing from 06 February 2023. The course module included Purpose of tendering, Pre-requisites of Tendering, Stages of Tendering process, Types of Tender, Tender Evaluation stage, finalization of Tender, Post Tendering process.

Shri Sibsankar Chakraborti, Superintending P.W.(Road) Directorate, Engineer, Government of West Bengal took the training sessions on Introduction to Public Works, different kind of PW Works, preparation of Estimates, preliminary estimates etc., provision in the Preliminary estimates for probable escalation in cost etc. Shri Shamideep Bhattacharya, Executive Engineer, Government of West Bengal imparted training on -- Detailed Estimatesbasis of preparation, Difference between Preliminary Detailed and estimates. Schedule Scheduled/Nonof rates-Scheduled items, items-analysis rates, Provision for contingencies in different kinds of works, Recasting of estimates-Supplementary/Revised estimate-Addition, Alterations and substitution of items - analysis of rates.

#### (iv) Audit of Public Private Partnerships:

India has systematically rolled out a PPP program for the delivery of high-priority public utilities and infrastructure and, over the last decade or so, developed what is perhaps one of the largest PPP Programs in the world.

With close to 2000 PPP projects in various stages of implementation, according to the World Bank, India is one of the leading countries in terms of readiness for PPPs.

The Government of India (GoI), in FY 2019-20, undertook a first-of-its-kind and a whole-of-government exercise to lay the infrastructure vision for the country. **Pursuant** which. to the **National** Infrastructure Pipeline (NIP), detailing the infrastructure vision for the country, was released in December 2019. NIP envisages investment of Rs.111 lakh crores over fiveyear period (2020-25). With annual average investment of ~Rs.22 lakh crore this is a significant step-up of ~2.5 times vis-à-vis historical levels. **Public Private** Partnerships (PPP) in infrastructure represent a valuable instrument to speed up infrastructure development in India and bridge the gap envisaged under NIP. Currently, there are 7600 projects under NIP.

In view of the above facts, the role of public auditors, therefore, becomes critical in assessing whether such arrangements are truly in public interest and are also fair and balanced in sharing of risks as well as rewards.

Regional Training Institute, Kolkata arranged a training programme on Audit of Public Private Partnership from 13 March 2023 to 17 March 2023. The training was focussed on providing clarity of the founding stones of PPP model to the participants as well as to give them a clearer picture of the role of audit by usage of Case Studies.

#### (G) Information Technology Training

#### (i) Training on e-Governance, iBEMS and PFMS

During the 1980s and early 1990s initial attempts towards e-Governance were made basically focusing towards networking government departments and developing inhouse government applications in the areas of defence, economic monitoring,

planning and the deployment of IT to manage data-intensive functions related to elections, census, tax administration etc.

e-Governance in India has steadily evolved from computerization of Government Departments to initiatives that encapsulate the finer points of Governance, such as citizen centricity, service orientation and transparency. Lessons from previous e-Governance initiatives have played an important role in shaping the progressive e-Governance strategy of the country.

The "e-Governance, iBEMS and PFMS" course has been designed to equip participants with the necessary background and understanding on structured approach for conceptualization of eGovernance initiatives, National e-Governance Plan (NeGP) along with imparting knowledge on the Integrated Budget and Expenditure Monitoring System (BEMS) with Public Financial Management System (PFMS). In order to accommodate the request of user offices, the training was conducted twice during the period October 2022 to March 2023.

The training covered topics on Introduction to e-Governance, NeGP, Digital India Framework. introduction to PFMS/IFMS, discussion on EIS Module of PFMS, PFMS

functionalities in IA&AD, generation of different reports in PFMS as per user requirement, objectives & functionalities of i-BEMS, role of PAO in i-BEMS, Role of i-BEMS in PFMS scenario etc: The faculties for the training included Shri Motiur Rahman, Senior Technical Director, National Informatics Centre, Kolkata, Shri Pinakee Dey, Senior Accounts Officer, Office of the Controller General of Accounts, Kolkata, Shri Sandip Konar, Assistant Accounts Officer, Office of the Principal Accountant General (A&E), West Bengal, Shri Pritam Ghosh, Assistant Audit Officer, Office of the Director General Of Audit(Central), Kolkata and Shri Pankaj Kumar Sardar, Assistant Audit Officer (P), Office of the Accountant General (Audit-II), West Bengal, Kolkata, Shri Jhuntu Dasgupta, Assistant Audit Officer. #### (ii) Ms Excel Advance

Microsoft Excel is a powerful spreadsheet application that has been used for decades in various industries and fields. It was first released in 1985 for Macintosh computers and was later released for Windows in 1987. Excel has since become the industry standard for spreadsheet software and is used by millions of people worldwide. Excel allows users to organize, manipulate, and analyze large amounts of data in a userfriendly interface. It offers a wide range of features, including graphing tools, pivot tables, formulas, and macros. With these features, users can perform complex calculations, generate charts and graphs, and automate repetitive tasks. Microsoft

Excel is a powerful spreadsheet software that offers both basic and advanced features. The features available in MS Excel Advance which are not available in MS Excel Basic inter alia are detailed below:-

- (a) Functionality: Excel Basic provides the basic functionality for creating and editing spreadsheets, while Excel Advance provides more advanced features, such as macros, pivot tables, and complex formulas.
- (b) User Interface: The user interface for Excel Basic is simpler, with fewer menus and options, while Excel Advance has a more complex user interface with many more features and options.

- (c) Complexity of Formulas: Excel Basic has a limited set of basic formulas, while Excel Advance provides a much wider range of advanced formulas and functions, allowing users to perform complex calculations.
- (d) Automation: Excel Advance provides the ability to automate tasks using macros, while Excel Basic does not have this feature.
- (e) Data Analysis: Excel Advance provides advanced data analysis tools, such as pivot tables and charts, which are not available in Excel Basic.

Excel Basic is suitable for simple data entry and calculations, while Excel Advance is better suited for more complex data analysis and automation tasks. In order to provide the participants an overview of the utility tools available in MS Excel Advance, a three-day training programme from 20.03.2023 was arranged by the Institute. The topics covered in the training were importing different types of files into Excel for analysis, calculations using formulas and functions, Excel Power Query- Cleaning, Sorting, Filtering data using Excel Power Query, Data Analysis with Excel Pivot Table and Appending and merging data using excel Power Query. The training was imparted by Shri Sushovan Assistant Audit Officer. Chatterjee, Regional Training Institute, Kolkata and the satisfaction level of the course was **4.77**.
