#### (Refers to paragraph 4.3.2) Executive Summary of Beneficiary Survey

Beneficiary's Awareness of the REGP Programmes

- REGP were commonly regarded as 'rural employment' programmes, rather than wage employment programmes for the 'rural poor'.
- Despite the fact that nearly half of the beneficiaries were literate, awareness regarding various components or features (wage rates under the scheme, source of labour) of the scheme was low. The provision in the scheme to demand employment, a special feature of the EAS scheme, was unknown to 98 per cent of the EAS beneficiaries. This reflects a serious limitation and weak linkage in the programme management and delivery.

Reach to the Target Group

- The REGP programmes focused on the poor of all villages rather than following an area specific approach to target the poorest of the poor in well-defined backward areas.
- The programme guidelines state that the wage employment opportunities should be provided only to the poor (BPL) households. The study revealed that 29 per cent of the JRY and the EAS beneficiaries (annual income more than Rs 19650) were APL, indicating absence of a proper selection mechanism and lack of monitoring of the beneficiary selection process. Despite the fact that programme mandate is to target poorest of poor in well defined backward areas, only one fifth of the total beneficiaries were among the poorest income bracket (annual income less than Rs 9825 per household).
- Nearly two-thirds of the beneficiaries of both JRY and EAS programmes were either SC or ST.
- The programme had envisaged addressing the economic upliftment and empowerment of women by reserving 30 per cent of the total man days of employment for women. The extent of employment of women could not be ascertained due to inadequately maintained records and muster rolls. However, the study revealed, even in terms of participation, only about 15 per cent in JRY and EAS beneficiaries were women.

Adequacy of Employment

 The main determinants of poverty are inextricably linked with the issues of rural productivity and unemployment including under-employment. Both JRY and EAS had envisaged providing upto 100 days of employment for two adult persons of each of the rural poor household, to make a sufficient dent on poverty. The study reveals on an average, a JRY beneficiary worked for 21 days and an EAS beneficiary for 27 days. Moreover, only one adult per family was given employment.

- There was a lack of transparency regarding work related to payment. Less than 40 per cent JRY and EAS workers were informed about standard output to justify a day's wages.
- Majority of the beneficiaries from both wage employment programmes reported working during the lean agricultural season.
- As per norms, the commonly followed practice was of weekly payments as reported by 42 per cent of JRY and 40 per cent of the EAS beneficiaries. In the JRY programme nearly 60 percent reported being correctly intimated on the periodicity of payments. In EAS programme, however, wide disparity was reported in adherence to the payment structure.
- Payments were made mostly in cash due to the unreliable irregular supplies of poor quality of food grains, which also spiralled into payment delays.
- Registration of EAS workers, to ensure repeated employment to two members of the family is yet a pipe dream. 86 per cent of the beneficiaries were not registered. Less than a third of those registered (4 per cent EAS beneficiaries) was issued family card.
- The absence of registration had reportedly increased payments to unregistered (and at times, non-targetted) workers and to the casual staff (including contractors).
- Inability to evolve technical and administrative support to effectively plan, oversee and monitor the programme were evident.
- Contractor/Middleman's Involvement
- Against the specific provisions that the Gram Panchayat was to directly recruit workers and channalize /implement 17 per cent of JRY and 31 per cent of EAS beneficiaries were paid by contractor.
- In case of EAS projects, the contractors also selected the projects to be implemented, negating the Panchayats coginition of community infrastructure needs and unauthorisedly by-passing the procedure of identification of a 'Shelf of Projects' to authenticate sustainable projects and ensure continuous employment on demand.
- More people reported being paid through the contractor than those reporting having worked with contractors.
- Survey disclosed that projects managed by BDOs / Panchayats were often actually implemented by the contractors.
- Survey discloed absence of a concerted effort to formulate a shelf of projects which could take into account the local needs and tackle unemployment/underemployment through special employment projects.

Signing of Muster Rolls

- In many cases improper, incomplete and non-maintenance of the muster rolls clearly reflected lack of authenticity of the extent of employment generated and genuineness of payments made to the beneficiaries.
- The survey revealed that nearly half of the beneficiaries had never ever signed on a register or muster roll while receiving payment.
- Adherence of Ceiling on Wage to Material Ratio
- The delivery mechanism under the Programmes was found not to have taken cognizance that REGP was primarily targeted at wage employment generation. Most of the allocation was directed towards material intensive works.
- Survey disclosed that, link roads, which were material intensive and scheduled to have only 20 per cent of the material resource allocation, had actually utilized about half of the total funds available. Similarly, civil constructions, again material intensive, directed at the construction of school buildings, Panchayat Bhawans, etc. had portions approximately 30 per cent of the funds for material allocation as against a stipulated 20 percent.
- The wage to material ratio was found to be 53:47 in JRY projects and 54:46 in EAS projects as against the norms of 60:40.

- Inventory and Verification of assets
- A total of 5032 assets covering roads, civil construction, tanks, dug wells, watershed activities, plantations, etc. were surveyed. Survey result showed that number of assets created under JRY: 3444 far exceeds those created under EAS: 1578.
- Majority of the assets created were Link Roads: 2509 and Civil Constructions: 1808.
- Functional status and patterns of usage
- Most of the assets verified during the survey were found to be in good condition and were used for the purpose created. However, some of the assets viz. tanks: 31 per cent and dug wells: 26 per cent were created on private lands.
- Nearly 55 per cent of the link roads were found to be connecting the houses of influential people.
- Involvement of local population in the maintenance of assets
- Involvement of local population in the creation and maintenance of assets was found to be missing. This resulted in lack of ownership towards the assets and asset creation and maintenance was perceived as government's (block or panchayat) responsibility. However, in certain cases, community was also found to be involved in the maintenance of assets viz., 5 per cent of the link roads was reportedly maintained by the community, more than 16 per cent of the plantations were found to be protected through social fencing, nearly one-fourth of the dug wells and about 13 per cent of the tanks and ponds were reportedly maintained by the community.
