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# **Preface**

This is the Sixteenth issue of our annual publication 'Accounts at a Glance'.

The Annual Accounts of the State Government are prepared and examined under the directions of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India in accordance with the requirements of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 for being laid before the Legislature of the State. The Annual Accounts consist of (a) Finance Accounts and (b) Appropriation Accounts. Finance Accounts are summary statement of accounts under the Consolidated Fund, Contingency Fund and the Public Account. The Appropriation Accounts record the Grant-wise expenditures against provisions approved by State Legislature and offer explanations for variations between the actual expenditure and the funds provided. The Office of the Accountant General (Accounts and Entitlements), Manipur prepares the State Finance Accounts and the Appropriation Accounts.

'Accounts at a Glance' provides a broad overview of Governmental activities, as reflected in the Finance Accounts and the Appropriation Accounts. The information is presented through brief explanations, statements and graphs.

We look forward to suggestions that would help us in improving the publications.

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#### **CHAPTER I**

#### **OVERVIEW**

#### 1.1 Introduction

The monthly accounts of the State Government are compiled and consolidated from the accounts submitted by the District Treasuries, Public Works and Forest Divisions, etc. to the Accountant General (Accounts and Entitlements). Besides, the Finance Accounts and the Appropriation Accounts are prepared annually by the Accountant General (Accounts and Entitlements) under the directions of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India in accordance with the requirements of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971.

#### 1.2 Structure of Accounts

#### 1.2.1 Government Accounts:

The accounts of Government are kept in the following three parts:

Part I Consolidated Fund
Part II Contingency Fund
Part III Public Account

There are two main divisions under the Consolidated Fund:

The Revenue division (Revenue Account) deals with the proceeds of taxation and other receipts classified as revenue and the expenditure met therefrom, the net result of which represents the revenue surplus or deficit for the year.

In the Capital division, the section 'Receipt Heads (Capital Account)' deals with receipts of capital nature which cannot be applied as a set off to capital expenditure. The section 'Expenditure Heads (Capital Account)' deals with expenditure met usually from borrowed funds with the object of increasing concrete assets of a material and permanent character. It also includes receipts of a capital nature intended to be applied as a set off to capital expenditure. The section 'Public Debt, Loans and Advances, etc.' comprises loans raised and their repayments by Government such as 'Internal Debt' and 'Loans and Advances' made (and their recoveries) by Government.

In the Contingency Fund, the transactions connected with Contingency Fund established under Article 267 of the Constitution of India are recorded.

In the Public Account, the transactions relating to 'Debt' (other than those included in Part I), 'Deposits', 'Advances', 'Suspense' and 'Remittances' are recorded.

Annual Accounts of the Government of Manipur for the year 2013-14 are being presented to the State Legislature. Audit Report of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India for the year 2013-14 is also being presented.

#### 1.3 Finance Accounts and Appropriation Accounts

#### 1.3.1 Finance Accounts

Finance Accounts present the accounts of receipts and outgoings of the Government for the year together with the financial results disclosed by the revenue and capital accounts, the accounts of the public debts and the liabilities and assets as worked out from the balances recorded in the accounts.

During 2013-14 total receipts amounted to ₹ 70,10.76 crore comprising ₹ 72,82.79 crore revenue receipts (₹ 19,11.52 crore Tax Revenue, ₹ 2,60.67 crore Non-Tax Revenue and ₹ 51,10.60 crore Grants-in-aid and Contributions), and ₹ (-) 2,72.03 crore capital receipts.

Disbursements during the year were ₹ 70,10.76 crore, that is, ₹ 57,18.83 crore (81.57 per cent) on revenue account and ₹ 12,91.93 crore (18.43 per cent) on capital account.

# 1.3.2 Appropriation Accounts

Appropriation Accounts bring out the expenditure of the State Government against amounts voted and charged by the State Legislature and supplement the Finance Accounts. These comprise accounts of 3 charged Appropriations and 50 voted Grants.

Appropriation Acts, 2013 and 14 for the year 2013-14 had projected for a gross expenditure of  $\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{}}{\stackrel{}}}$  99,76.16 crore, including the Supplementary Grants of  $\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{}}{\stackrel{}}}$  5,41.36 crore, passed by State Legislature during the year. An amount of  $\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{}}{\stackrel{}}}$  28.66 crore was projected as recoveries in reduction of expenditure.

Appropriation Accounts 2013-14 show disbursements aggregating ₹ 75,55.33 crore against the aggregate budget provision of ₹ 99,76.16 crore, resulting to saving of ₹ 24,20.84 crore against Grants and Appropriations.

Recoveries in reduction of expenditure amounted to ₹ 9.97 crore reflecting a decrease of ₹ 18.69 crore vis-à-vis budget estimates.

#### 2.2 RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS

Total receipts during the year were ₹ 7010.76 crore, against which total disbursements were ₹ 7010.76 crore.

#### 2.3 RECEIPTS

#### 2.3.1 Revenue Receipts

Gross Tax Revenue of ₹ 1911.52 (including Share of Union Taxes/Duties) crore and Non-Tax Revenue of ₹ 260.67 crore formed 13.10 per cent and 1.79 per cent respectively of the GSDP. Major contributors to revenue were ₹ 5110.60 crore under Grants-in-Aid and Contributions.

Net tax receipts during the year were lower than the budget estimates by ₹ 318.30 crore, mainly on account of less collection of Taxes on income and expenditure, Water Supply and Sanitations.

#### 2.4 CAPITAL RECEIPTS

Compared to the revised estimates, there was an overall decrease of ₹ 650.58 crore in Capital Receipt.

The decrease was mainly under receipts of Borrowing and Other Liabilities.

#### 2.5 DISBURSEMENTS

#### 2.5.1 Revenue Disbursements

Revenue Disbursement was 39.20 per cent of GSDP. It was less than the budget estimates by ₹ 974.12 crore due to less disbursement of ₹ 226.62 Crore under Non-Plan Expenditure and less disbursement of ₹ 747.50 crore under Plan Expenditure.

# 2.5.2 Capital Disbursements

Capital Disbursements were 8.85 per cent of the GSDP. It was less than budget estimates by ₹ 1238.82 crore due to less disbursement under Plan Expenditure (₹ 1237.61 crore) and Non-plan Expenditure (₹1.21 crore) respectively.

#### 2.5.3 Plan Disbursements

During the year 2013-14, Plan Disbursements were ₹ 1958.81 crore under State Plan and ₹ 546.03 crore under Centrally Sponsored Plan Schemes and Central Plan Schemes.

# 2.5.4 Non-Plan Disbursements

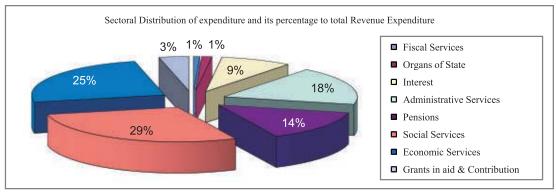

#### 2.7 DEBTS AND LIABILITIES

**2.7.1** Outstanding Public Debt at the end of 2013-14 was ₹ 4163.69 crore, comprising internal debt of ₹ 3680.35 crore and loans and advances from Central Government of ₹ 483.34 crore. Other liabilities accounted under Public Account were ₹ 2896.99 crore.

2.7.2 The State also acts as a banker and trustee in respect of deposits like small savings collections, provident funds and deposits. There was an overall increase of ₹ 88.68 crore in respect of such liabilities of State Government during 2013-14.

2.7.3 Interest payments on debt and other liabilities totalling ₹ 475.22 crore constituted 8.31 per cent of revenue expenditure of ₹ 5718.83 crore. Interest payments of ₹ 444.92 crore were on account of Internal debt: ₹ 294.68 crore, loans and advances from Central Governments: ₹ 41.04 crore and ₹ 109.20 crore on other liabilities. Expenditure on account of interest payments increased by ₹ 11.91 crore during 2013-14.

**2.7.4** Internal debt of ₹ 657.19 crore raised during 2013-14 was mainly used for (i) discharge of debt obligations of ₹ 487.50 crore and (ii) payments of interest of ₹444.92 crore. Net funds available was (-) ₹ 275.23 crore.

#### 2.8 INVESTMENTS AND RETURNS

Total investments as share capital in non-financial Public Sector Undertakings (PSU) etc. stood at ₹ 160.30 crore at the end of 2013-14. Dividends received during the year were ₹ 3,000 on investment. During 2013-14, investments in PSUs increased by ₹ 10 lakh, and there is a decrease of ₹ 1,000 in dividend income over the previous year.

#### 2.9 LOANS AND ADVANCES BY THE STATE GOVERNMENT

Total loans and advances made by the State Government during 2013-14 was ₹ 4 lakh. Recovery of principal amount aggregating ₹ 205.13 crore and interest on loan amounting to ₹\* crore was in arrears at the end of 31 March 2014. Total loans and advances to Government Corporations/Companies, non-Government Institutes, Local bodies, etc. during 2013-2014 is ₹ Nil crore, and recovery of principal amounting to ₹ 194.17 crore and interest on loan amounting to ₹ \* crore is in arrears at the end of March 2014.

#### 2.10 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO LOCAL BODIES AND OTHERS

Assistance to local bodies etc during 2013-14 was ₹ 807.62 crore. It was increased from ₹ 382.55 crore in 2009-10 to ₹ 807.62 crore in 2013-14 which was 111.11 per cent increase in the last five years (₹ 382.55, ₹ 666.80, ₹731.40, ₹ 773.50 and ₹ 807.62). District Councils, Loktak Development Authority, Manipur Development Society, District Rural Development Agency, Jawaharlal Nehru Institute of Medical Sciences, State Health Mission Society (SHMS), Manipur State Rural Roads Development Agency and Kangla Fort Board consumed the major portion (₹ 292.67, ₹ 23.18, ₹ 41.25, ₹139.58, ₹ 55.00, ₹ 26.33, ₹ 19.91 and ₹30.89) of the total grant during 2013-14.

#### 2.11 APPROPRIATION ACCOUNTS

The Appropriation Accounts of the Government of Manipur for the year 2013-14 present the accounts of sums expended in the year ended 31 March 2014, compared with the sums specified in the Schedules appended to the Appropriation Acts passed under Article 204 and 205 of the Constitution of India. The Appropriation Accounts show that in the year 2013-14, there was actual expenditure of ₹ 7555.33 crore, comprising of ₹ 5725.79 crore on Revenue accounts, ₹ 1294.91 crore on Capital accounts, ₹ 534.59 crore for Repayment of Debt, and ₹ 0.04 crore as Loans and Advances by the State Government. There were savings/excesses under Revenue/Capital/Public Debt/Loans and Advances with reference to total grants allocated by the State Legislature, as shown below:

#### 2.13 SUBMISSION OF ACCOUNTS BY TREASURIES AND DIVISIONS

Under the Government of Manipur, there are 11 (eleven) treasuries and 1 (one) Sub-treasury rendering monthly accounts to the Accountant General (A&E), Manipur. During 2013-14, rendering monthly accounts of 8 (Eight) treasuries viz, Ukhrul, Jiribam, Imphal East, Lamphel, Churachandpur, Kangpokpi, Imphal West and Senapati was delayed by 1 to 15 days and 4 (Four) treasuries viz, Tamenglong, Chandel, Bishnupur and Thoubal were delayed by 16 to 30 days. However, the average delay in receipts of all the treasuries accounts is 10 (Ten) days. Similarly, 104 compiled accounts of Public Work Divisions and 29 compiled accounts of Forest Divisions have also been included before the close of Annual accounts. The average delay in receipts of all the compiled accounts are 21 (Twenty One) days in respect of PW Divisions and 4 (Four) days in respect of Forest Divisions respectively.

#### 3.2 GOVERNMENT ACCOUNT

The total expenditure (Revenue and Capital) for the year is netted against total receipts (Revenue and non-debt Capital receipts) of the year and the surplus thereof is transferred to a separate ledger called "Government Account". In addition, net effect of Prior Period Adjustments, Miscellaneous Government Accounts, etc. is also transferred to the ledger "Government Account". Thus, the ledger "Government Account" represents the cumulative surplus/deficit of the operations of the Government. The details of the ledger "Government Account" for the past five years are given below.

#### 3.3 LIABILITIES

Liabilities of the State Government increased by ₹ 1541.74 crore from ₹ 5518.94 crore in 2009-10 to ₹ 7060.68 crore during 2013-14. Public debt comprising internal debt of the State Government and loans and advances from the Central Government increased by ₹ 607.53 crore from ₹ 3556.16 crore in 2009-2010 to ₹ 4163.69 crore at the end of the current year (2013-14). Article 293 of the Constitution of India empowers the State Government to borrow on the security of the Consolidated Fund of the State within such limits, if any, as may be from time to time fixed by the State Legislature. Details of the Public Debt and total liabilities of the State Government are as under:

#### 3.6 WAYS AND MEANS ADVANCES

The State Government, in order to maintain and sustain its liquidity position, takes Ways and Means Advances from the Reserve Bank of India and thereafter, draws upon overdraft whenever there is shortfall in the agreed minimum cash balance in its account with the Reserve Bank of India. The State Government is required to maintain the minimum cash balance of ₹ 60 lakh with Reserve Bank of India. The larger the amount and greater the number of times such ways and means advances are taken or drawals made, the more it reflects upon the adverse position of the cash balance of the State Government.

#### 3.7 GENERAL CASH BALANCES

The closing cash balance according to the Reserve Bank of India was ₹ (-)65.35 crore against the general cash balance of ₹(-)72.82 crore reflected in State Govt. accounts. The difference of ₹ 7.47 crore was due to net unadjusted balance by RBI for ₹ 7.47 crore which is under reconciliation.

Investments held in the Cash Balance Investment Account \*as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2014 were ₹ 315.10 crore.

Other cash balances and investment comprising cash with departmental officers (₹ Rs. 36.85 crore), permanent advances with departmental officers (₹ 0.02 crore) and investment of earmarked funds (₹ 179.99 crore) as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2014 were at ₹ 216.86 crore.
