MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE DEPARTMENTAL SCREENING COMMITTEE FOR CONSIDERATION OF APPOINTMENT ON COMPASSIONATE GROUND TO THE DEPENDENT OF DECEASED GOVERNMENT SERVANT FOR THE PANEL YEAR 2023

The Departmental Screening Committee (D.S.C.) consisting of Ms. Meena Kumari Meena, Director, O/o PDA, NWR, Jaipur, Sh. Prithavipal Singh Kanawat, Sr. DAG, O/o PAG (A&E), Rajasthan, Jaipur and Sh. Sanjeev Kumar Surana, Sr. DAG, O/o AG(Audit II), Rajasthan, Jaipur as constituted by Principal Director of Audit, North Western Railway, Jaipur met on 09.03.2023 to assess the necessity and suitability of the candidates for appointment on compassionate ground as per standing instructions on the subject.

- 2. The appointments under the scheme of appointment on compassionate ground are regulated as per instructions issued by Govt. of India, Department of Personnel & Training OM No. OM No. 14014/1/2022-Estt. (D) dated 02.08.2022 and in terms of HQ Circular No. 14 No. 52- Staff Entt. (Rules)/A.R./02-2021 dated 20.04.2022 alongwith supplementary instructions issued by the Headquarters from time to time.
- 3. In terms of HQ Circular No. 52-Staff Entt.(Rules)/A.R./02-2021 dated 20.04.2022, the committee verified that there are two (2) vacancies available for making compassionate appointments in Group 'C' posts in year 2023.
- 4. Case of one applicant viz. Sh. Inder Singh was submitted to the DSC for consideration.
- 5. The committee reviewed the application dated 16.01.2023 having unique registration no. B205427I160123001 and physical verification report dated 14.02.2023 submitted by nominated officer i.e. Sh. D. K. Gupta, Sr. Audit Officer, North Western Railway, Jaipur.
- 6. The committee, based on revised evaluation system i.e. Annexure V(ii) of HQ's circular No. 14 No. 52- Staff Entt. (Rules)/A.R./02-2021 dated 20.04.2022, evaluated the applicant and the score obtained by him is given in the Annexure.

Opinion of the committee in this case is as follows: -

The case was examined in detail. The score obtained in this case was 100 out of 165 as per revised evaluation system.

Late Sh. Bal Kishan Singh, MTS (Date of Appointment 01.06.1994 and date of death 09.10.2022) had died about 9 years 4 months before his due date of retirement i.e. 31.01.2032.

Deceased employee left behind him wife and two children (one son aged about 23 years; one unmarried daughter aged about 21 years), all of them were wholly dependent on the deceased employee at time of his death.

The committee further noted that the family has no movable and immovable property except barren land measuring 0.8093-hectare which is not cultivable and doesn't provide any income to the family.

The object of the scheme for compassionate appointment is to grant of appointment on compassionate grounds to a wholly depended family member of a Govt servant dying in harness or who is retired on medical grounds, thereby leaving his family in penury and without any means of livelihood, to relieve the family of the Government servant concerned from financial destitution and to help it get over the emergency.

Considering the facts and circumstances and the spirit of the scheme for compassionate appointment the committee is of view that there is social liability of marriage of unmarried daughter and son of deceased government servant as well as family has liability to manage day to day expenditure on maintenance of family. Further, applicant son of deceased employee is pursuing higher studies. There is no earning member in the family and family has no source of income other than pension. Therefore, DSC taking into account circumstances and financial condition of family, recommends Sh. Inder Singh for appointment on compassionate ground.
